Have you ever seen what happens when a vehicle collides with crash barrier at 60mph? Or witnessed for yourself the life-saving capabilities of passively safe, crash friendly street furniture?

Well now you can! On **6th July 2022** Passive Safety UK will be holding another **FREE to attend** National Passive Safety Crash Demonstration Day. This unique, exciting and informative event is taking place at Darley Moor Sports Centre, near Ashbourne, Derbyshire. DE6 2ET

This year our **five live crash demonstrations** will include: a traditional, unforgiving 140mm diameter steel post struck at high speed; an aluminium passive post installed **within the working width** of a TCB restraint system; an aluminium passive post supporting a VMS, solar panel and wind turbine assembly, a 15m KAPU HE classed lighting column and a new fibre composite signal pole, complete with energised signal heads and an electrical isolation system



Additional demonstrations and a large exhibition of other products and services compatible with road safety will also take place adjacent to the crash area. Due to the opportunity to learn from the day, **this event is endorsed for CPD certificates by both the CIHT and the IHE.**
